This matter comes before the Court on Plaintiff Brandi Bitterman's Motion for Summary Disposition, filed November 17, 2014. The Court issued an Order Granting Partial Summary Disposition to Plaintiff on January 26, 2015. The Court reserved the remainder of its ruling.


On March 4, 2015, the Court heard testimony, reviewed evidence, and considered argument and, being fully advised in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

1. That the Court grants summary disposition to Plaintiff under MCR 2.116(C)(10), as the Defendant Village of Oakley ("the Village")

failed to provide records pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, MCL 15.231 *et seq.*

2. That the Village shall conduct a thorough search of **all** Village records and identify those records responsive to Plaintiff's FOIA request.
3. That the Village shall provide all such documents to Plaintiff, through her counsel, within 30 days from the date of entry of this order.
4. That the Village may charge costs for the search and reproduction of the records, subject to the requirement that the costs comply with MCL 15.234.
5. That all such documents containing confidential information shall be subject to a protective order pursuant to MCR 2.302. For purposes of this order, "confidential information" means any personally identifying information about police reservists **except** their names.
6. That each page subject to the protective order shall be stamped "Confidential: Subject to Protective Order." Such designation shall make any copies, prints, summaries, excerpts, or other reproductions of such documents subject to this order.
7. That the confidential material will not, without leave of Court, be communicated in any way to anyone except the attorneys and parties.
